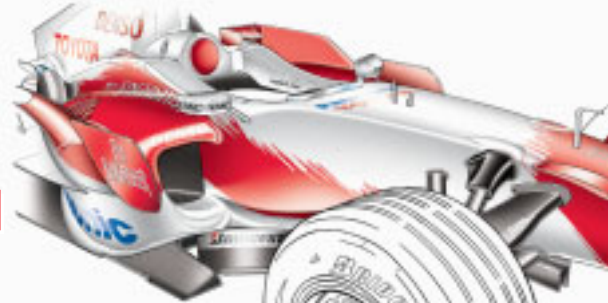

## Aspiring after the long-cherished desire of winning 1st place at the F1 Japanese Grand Prix at Fuji Speedway with the TF107 chassis

TOYOTA fulfilled a dream they had held for years by entering F1 competition in 2002. TOYOTA took the 6th place prize in their racing debut at the Australian Grand Prix and showed their ability to the world.

In 2005, with the goal of standing on the winner's podium, TOYOTA achieved this goal by their second race at the Malaysia Grand Prix. Reaping the fruits of the prior three years, they made great strides and won 4th place in the Constructor's composite rankings. Despite further expected leaps for 2006, they could not fare better than the previous year and ended up in 6th place overall in the Constructor's composite rankings.

In the upcoming 2007 season, with their more advanced TF107 specification F1 chassis, TOYOTA aspires for another success surpassing the 2005 season and to accomplish their long-cherished desire - winning 1st place at the F1 Japanese Grand Prix at Fuji Speedway in 2007.
